With a nod to taxidermied animals who tend to be a little spooky, this fun little plush bat will fit right in with your Halloween décor. If you do not want to mount him to a wood plaque, use fishing line and let him fly from your ceiling.

Fabrics Needed

Faux fur	1/4 yard
Faux leather	1/4 yard

Materials Needed

Pellon [®] 420 Fashion Fuse™	1/2 yard
Pellon [®] 72F Peltex [®] II	1/3 yard
Pellon [®] Basic Fill	1 package
Wood Plaque	One 9" x 13-1/2"
Sandpaper	
Gold spray paint	
Heavy Duty adhesive or hot glue	
Glue stick or double sided tape	
Black thread

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Instructions

Step 1. Lightly sand the edges of the wood plaque and wipe with a dry cloth. Spray with two coats of gold spray paint, allowing time to dry between coats.



Step 2. Fuse Fashion Fuse™ to the wrong side of the faux fur following manufacturer's instructions.



Step 3. Print and cut pattern pieces found on the template pages. Set printer to 100%. With right side facing down, cut two bat body shapes from the faux fur.



Step 4. With right side down, cut two bat wings from faux leather. Flip the pattern piece over and cut two additional pieces. Trim the template on the red dashed line and then cut two bat wings from Peltex® II.



Step 5. Sandwich one Peltex® II bat wing each between two faux leather bat wings (with right sides facing out). Use an iron on the lowest setting to lightly press to adhere the Peltex® II to the interior of the bat wings. Use a dry press cloth to protect the faux leather. Flip over and lightly press on the other side.



Step 6. Using black thread, topstitch around the entire bat wing using a 1/4" seam allowance.



Step 7. With right sides together, pin bat body pieces.



Step 8. Stitch around the perimeter of the body using a 1/4" seam allowance, leaving an opening for turning. Clip notches in the curves and trim ear points.

NOTE: If not mounting on a board, place the two bat wings in place along the sides before stitching. See template for placement. Catch only the end of the wings while stitching the body. Leave the opening below the wings.



Step 9. Turn bat body right side out and push out the ear points carefully with a pointed tool. Stuff with the Basic Fill and hand-stitch the opening closed.

Step 10. Using heavy duty adhesive or hot glue, attach the bat wings to the wood plaque, place them a bit toward the top of the plaque. This will leave room at the bottom to attach the name.

Step 11. Using heavy duty adhesive or hot glue, attach bat body to the plaque on top of the wings.

Step 12. Print out bat name and attach to the plaque using double sided tape, spray adhesive or glue stick.

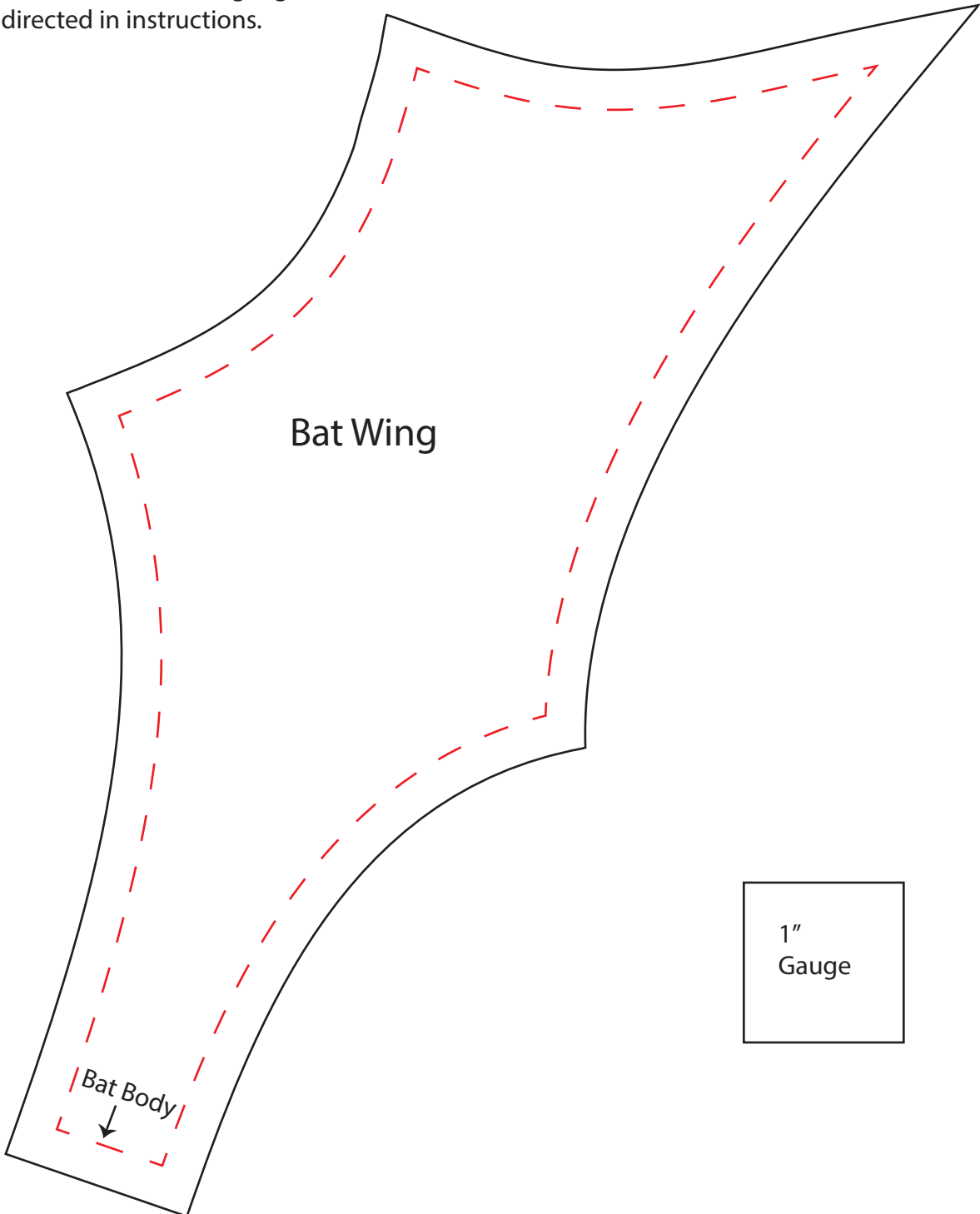
