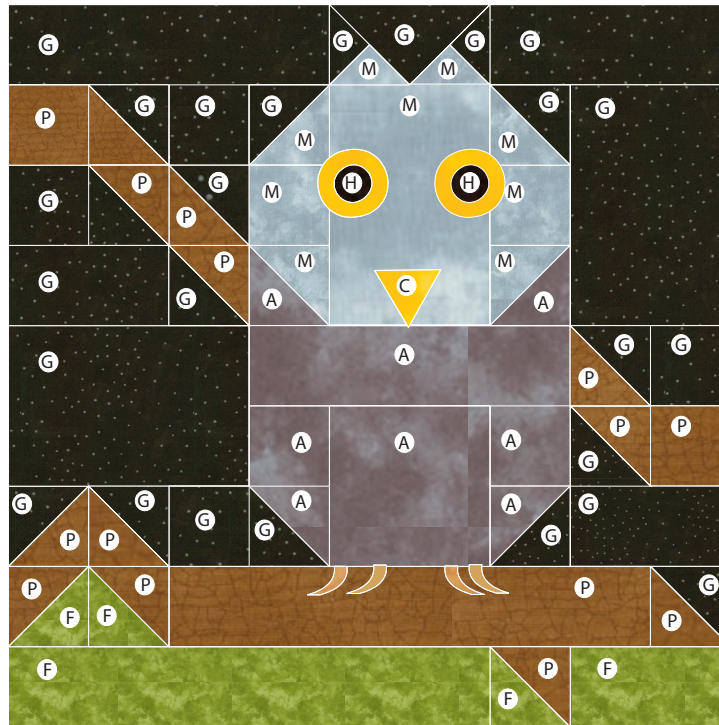


Owl - Block 7 of 13 - 9" Finished

All seam allowances are 1/4".






### Cutting Instructions

Fabric A 

Cut one 2-1/2" square.  
Cut two 1-7/8" squares.  
Cut one 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle.  
Cut two 1-1/2" squares.

Fabric C   
Fabric F 

Cut two eyes and one nose. See template on page 7.  
Cut one 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangle.  
Cut one 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangle.  
Cut two 1-7/8" squares.  
Cut two 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangles.  
Cut one 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle.  
Cut one 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangle.  
Cut four 1-1/2" squares.  
Cut three 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangles.  
Cut one 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangle.  
Cut eight 1-7/8" squares.

Cut two eyes. See template on page 7.  
Cut four feet. See template on page 7.  
Cut one 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangle.  
Cut three 1-7/8" squares.

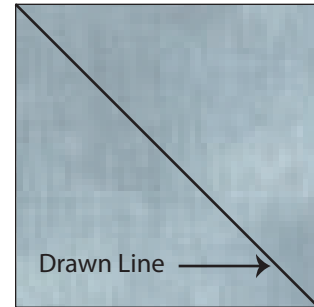
Cut two 1-1/2" squares.  
Cut one 2-1/4" square.  
Cut seven 1-7/8" squares.  
Cut one 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangle.  
Cut two 1-1/2" squares.

Seam Allowances are not always shown.

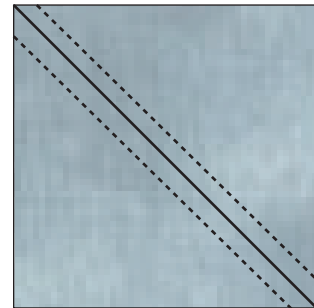
## Half Square Triangles

Make half square triangles by placing two 1-7/8" squares right sides together. Draw a diagonal line as shown on the lighter of two squares. Squares to place together are shown below.

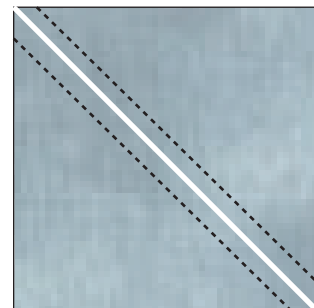

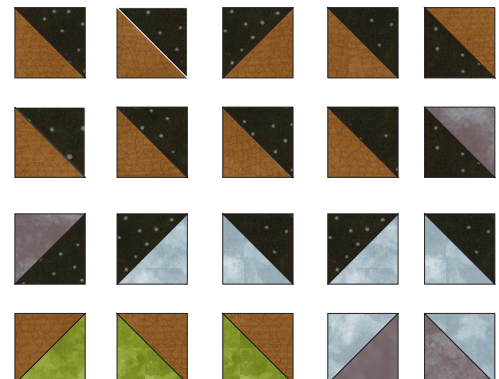
Sew 1/4" on each side of the drawn line.



Cut on the drawn line.



Press seam towards the darker of the two fabrics. Half square triangle units needed shown at right. The next step will use two of the fabric G/fabric M HSTs. Set the rest aside for later.



The top of the owl head will be created by making what is called a 'flying geese' unit in quilting using two fabric G/fabric M HSTs and a 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangle of fabric G.

Place one of the fabric G/fabric M HST units just made on the 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" fabric G rectangle, right sides together, matching raw edges. Make sure the HST is oriented as shown.

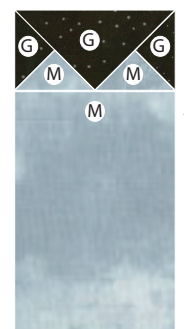
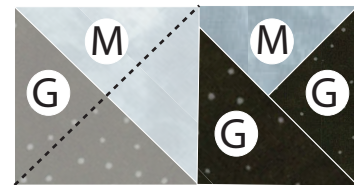
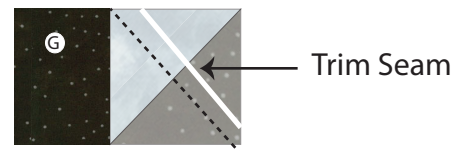
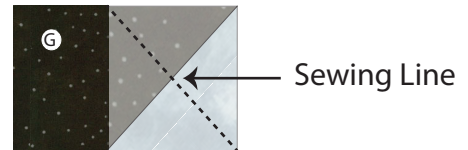
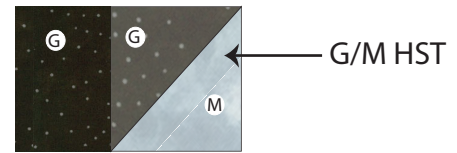
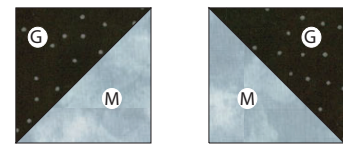
Sew on the diagonal as shown. Press towards the outside corner.

Trim seam allowance to 1/4" as shown. Press HST towards the outside.

Place the remaining G/M HST right sides together on the opposite corner of the fabric G 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangle as shown. Stitch the diagonal line as shown. Trim same as previous step. Trim seam allowance to 1/4". Press HST towards the outside.

NOTE: The orientation of the HST is the reverse of the previous one and will overlap the first one sewn on. This will create the Flying Geese unit with a 1/4" seam allowance at the top (not shown in diagram).

Sew one 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" fabric M rectangle to the flying geese unit just made as shown. Press seam in direction of arrow.



Sew the half square triangle (HST) units to the fabric pieces shown at right.

- Fabric P 1-1/2" square to HST G/P as shown
- Fabric G 1-1/2" square to HST G/M as shown
- Fabric G 1-1/2" square to HST G/P as shown
- HST G/P to Fabric M 1-1/2" square as shown
- HST G/P to HST A/M as shown
- HST G/M to Fabric M 1-1/2" square to HST A/M as shown
- HST G/P to HST G/P as shown
- HST F/P to HST F/P as shown
- HST G/P to Fabric G 1-1/2" square as shown
- HST G/P to Fabric P 1-1/2" square as shown
- Fabric A 1-1/2" square to HST A/G as shown
- Fabric P 1-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangle to HST G/P as shown
- HST F/P to Fabric F 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangle as shown

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.

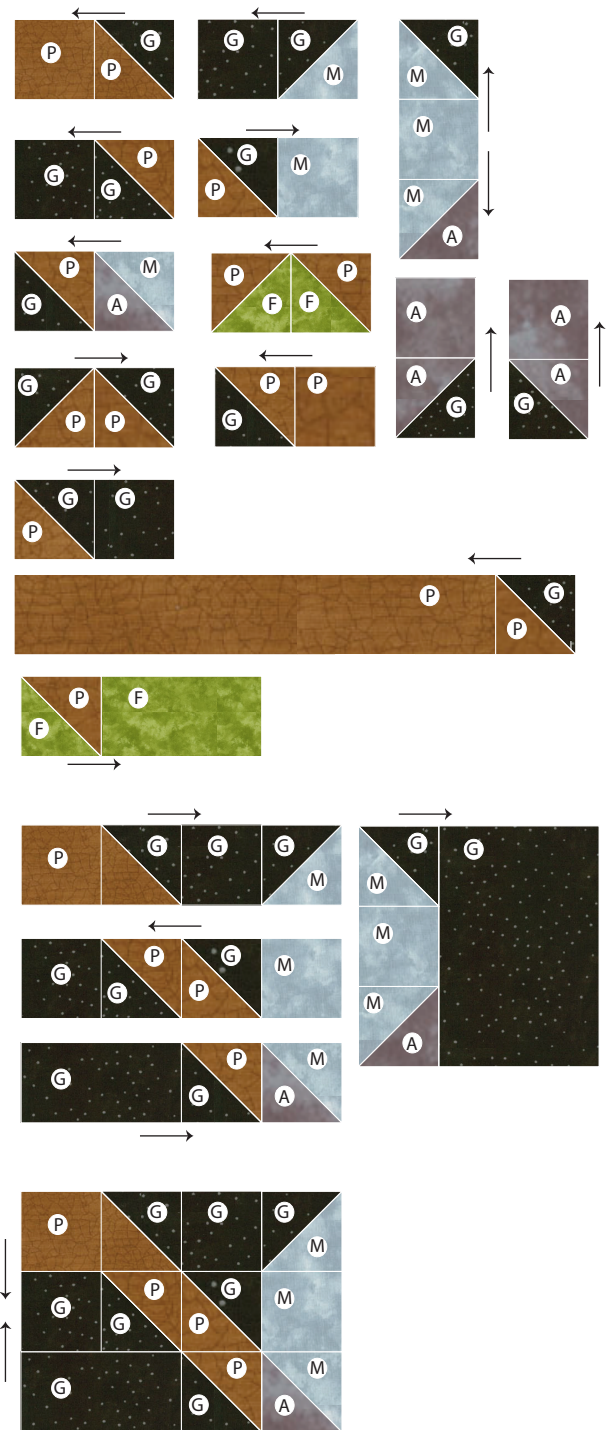
Sew the pieces shown at right to the units.

- Unit with HST G/P to unit with HST G/M as shown
- Unit with HST G/P to unit with HST G/P as shown
- Fabric G 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangle to unit shown
- Fabric G 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangle to unit shown

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.

Sew the units together shown at right.

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.

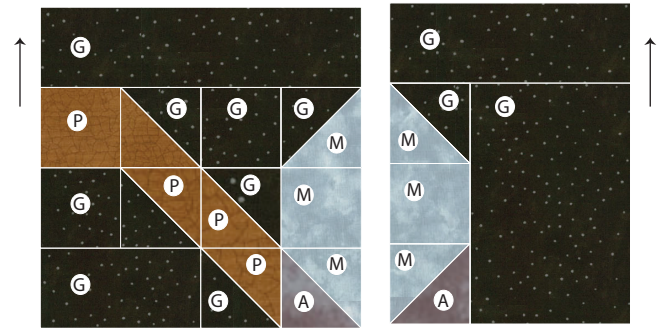


Sew the pieces shown at right to the units.

Fabric G 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle to the unit as shown

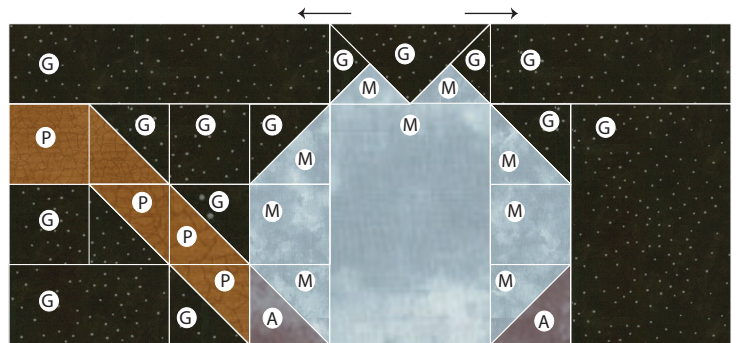
Fabric G 1-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangle to the unit as shown

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.



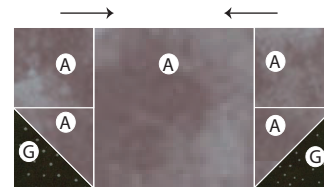
Sew the three units together shown at right.

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.



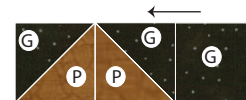
Sew fabric A 2-1/2" square to the two units shown at right.

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.



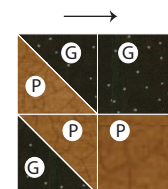
Sew fabric G 1-1/2" square to the unit shown at right.

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.



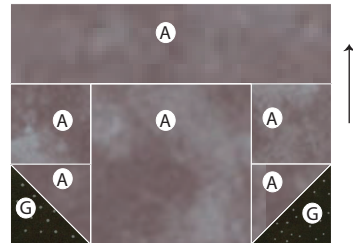
Sew the two units together shown at right.

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.



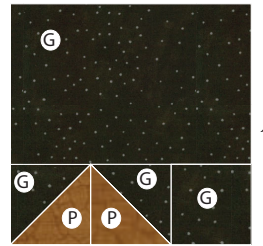
Sew fabric A 1-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangle to the section as shown at right.

Press seam in the direction of the arrow.



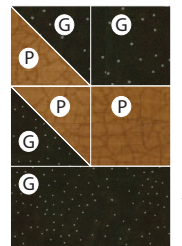
Sew fabric G 2-1/2" x 3-1/2" rectangle to the section as shown at right.

Press seam in the direction of the arrow.



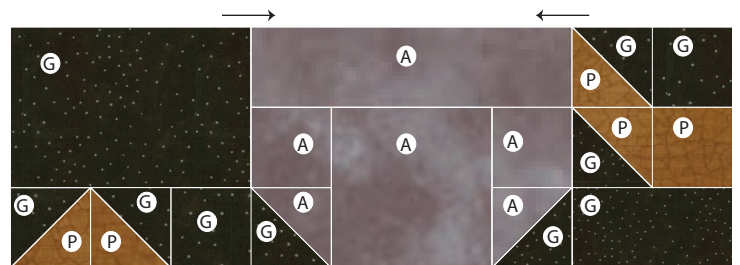
Sew fabric G 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" rectangle to the section as shown at right.

Press seam in the direction of the arrow.



Sew the three units together shown at right.

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.



Sew the units together shown at right.

Press seams in the direction of the arrows.

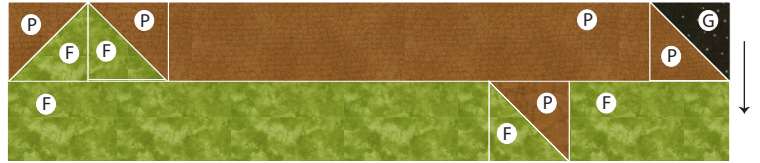


Sew fabric F 1-1/2" x 7-1/2" rectangle to the unit shown at right.



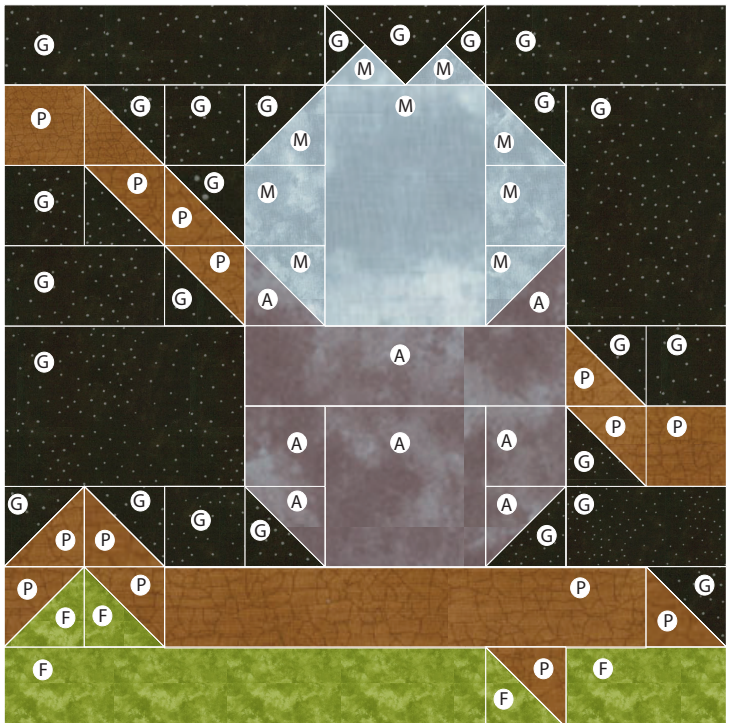
Press seam in the direction of the arrow.

Sew the sections together shown at right.



Press seam in the direction of the arrow.

Sew the sections of the block together shown at right.



Press seams open.

For machine applique, trace the template onto the paper side of the Wonder-Under®. Iron the Wonder-Under® to the wrong side of the fabric for the eyes, nose and claws. Cut out the applique pieces. Remove the paper and fuse into place on the block following placement on page 1. Finish the edge with either a straight or zigzag stitch.

For hand applique, use the template below, add a scant seam allowance and stitch using a favorite applique method.
