A fun, easy and creative way to turn your favorite images into a unique wall hanging. Make one for yourself and one to giveaway. Finished size is 20 1/2" x 20 1/2".

Fabrics Needed

Border	3/8 yard
Sashing	1/4 yard
Binding	1/4 yard
Backing	3/4 yard

Materials Needed

Pellon® 70 gram Lutradur®	Two 8 1/2" x 10"
Pellon® Legacy™ Natural Cotton Batting No Scrim	1/4 yard
Liquitex™ Gesso	One small bottle

Tools Needed

- Sewing machine and related supplies
- Rotary Cutter and related supplies
- Inkjet Printer
- Sponge Brush

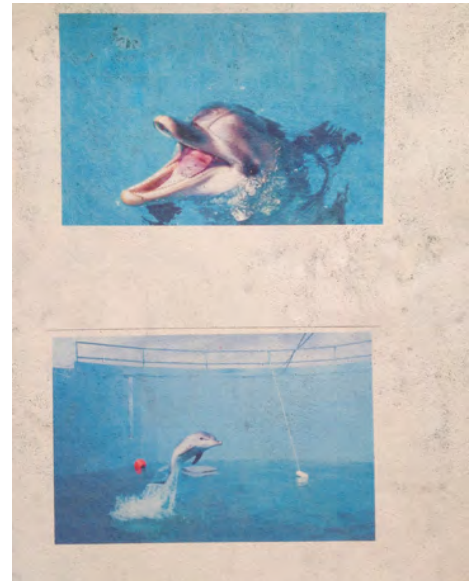
Cutting and Assembly Instructions

- Cut two pieces Lutradur® 8 1/2" x 10"
- Cut eight sashing strips 2 3/8" x 4 1/2".
- Cut eight sashing strips 2 3/8" x 8 1/4".
- Cut two 3" x 16" for border.
- Cut two 3" x 21" for border.

Pre-treat the Lutradur® with the Liquitex Gesso as per instructions on the bottle. Select four photos for printing. NOTE: Finished photo size should be 4" x 4".



Place the fully dried sheets of Lutradur® into the printer. Print two photos per sheet. Cut the photos apart leaving a 1/4" seam allowance on all sides.



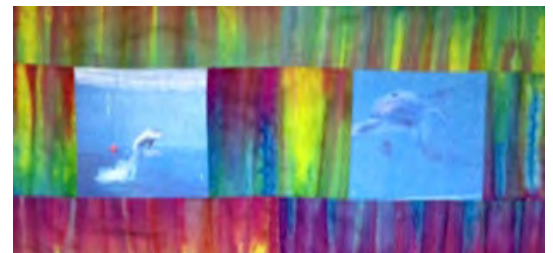
Sew one 2 3/8" x 4 1/2" piece of sashing on each side of the 4 1/2" photo pieces, right sides together, using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams toward the sashing.



Sew one 2 3/8" x 8 1/4" piece of sashing to the top and bottom of the photo unit, right sides together, using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams toward the top and bottom sashing.

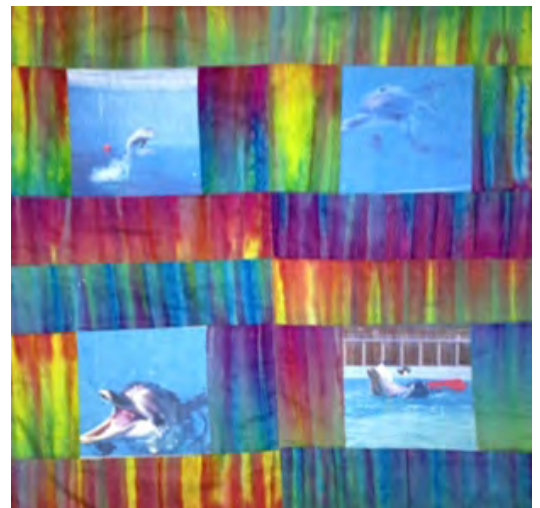


Sew two blocks together using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seam to the left.

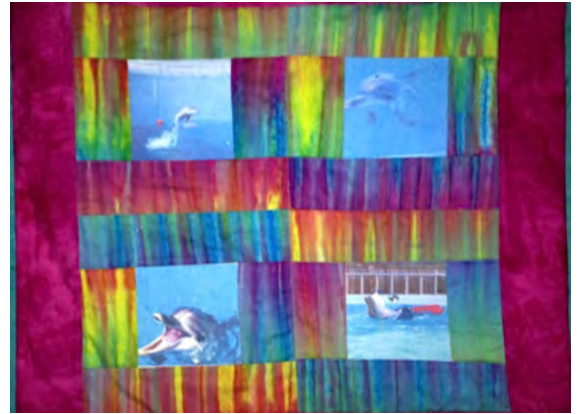


Sew the remaining two blocks together using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seam to the right.

Sew the two sections of blocks together. Press seam open.



Sew the 3" x 16" border strips to both sides of the quilt using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams toward borders.



Sew the 3" x 21" border strips to the top and bottom of the quilt using a 1/4" seam allowance. Press seams towards borders.



Layer the quilt back, batting and quilt top together. Quilt as desired.

Bind quilt.
