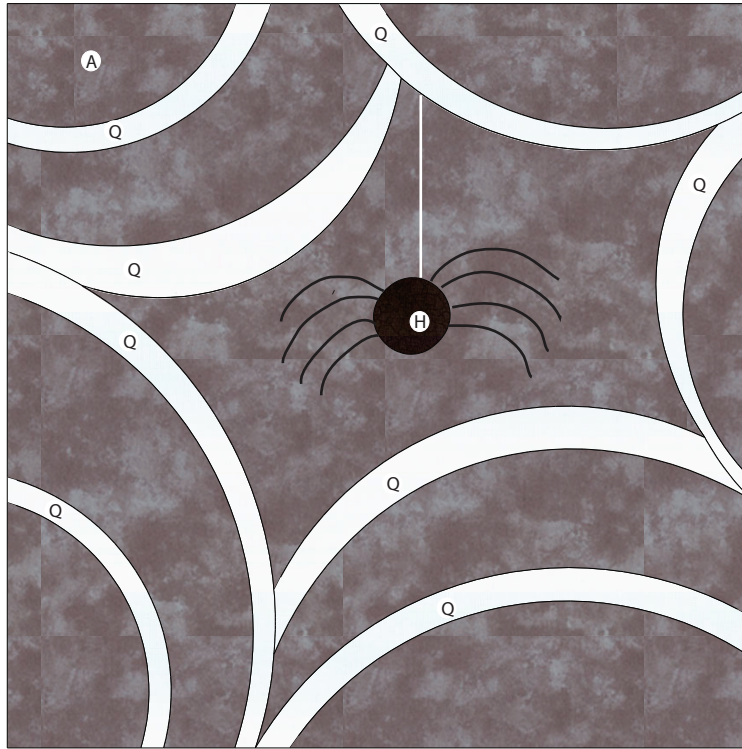


Spider Web - Block 9 of 13 - 9" Finished  
Refer to Trick or Treat Quilt-a-Long Overview for fabric lettering and requirements.  
All seam allowances are 1/4".

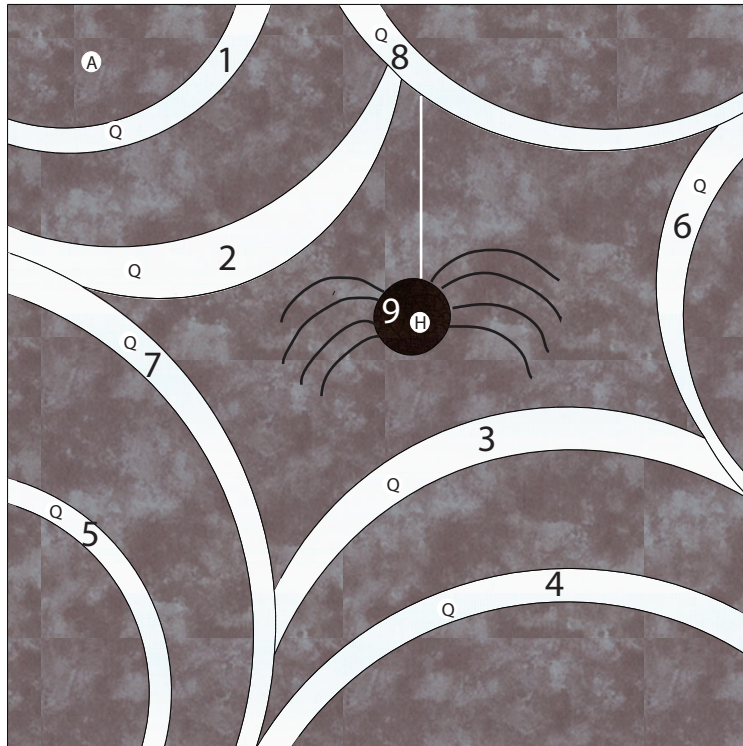


## Cutting Instructions

Fabric A	Cut one 10-1/2" square. (This will be trimmed down to 9-1/2" after stitching)
Fabric H	Cut one spider applique following template on page 3.
Fabric Q	Cut web applique piecing following templates on page 3 and 4.

## Additional Supplies for this Block

- DMC® Floche or DMC® Embroidery Floss
  - One white skein
  - One black skein
- Small amount of white and black fiber glitter (Optional)
- Small amount of fabric glue (Optional)
- Small amount of Pellon® Perfect Loft™ Cluster Fiber Fill (Optional)



Using a favorite applique method, applique the web pieces following the order shown above. Applique the spider body. The body may be a stuffed circle, a padded circle or just a fabric circle. This design is ideal for the back basting method of applique. Instructions for back-basting applique can be found on the designer's web-site: <http://www.artbyalexa.com/Tutorials.html>

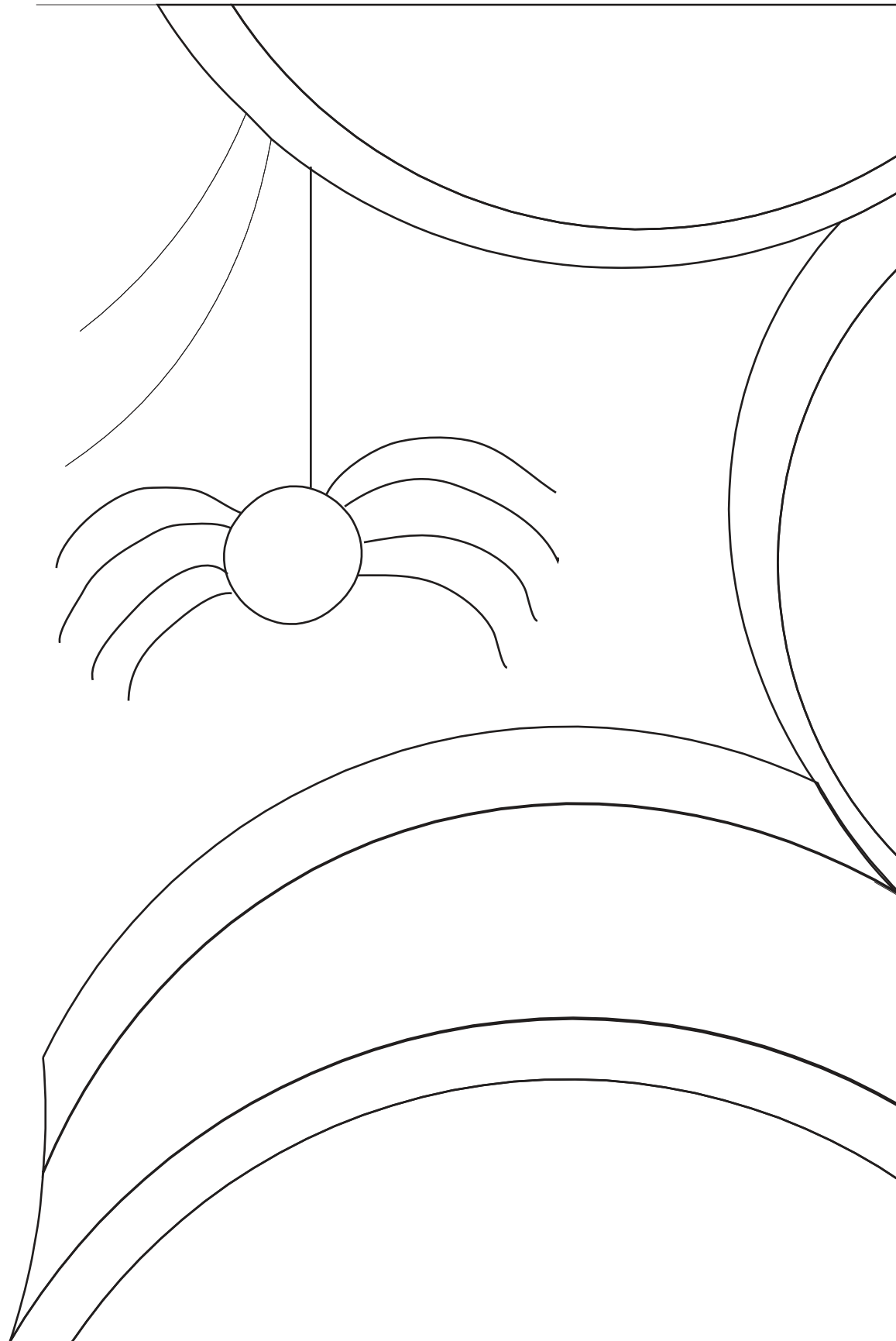
After applique is complete, draw the spider's legs and the connecting thread onto the block. Using two strands black embroidery floss or or one strand black Floche, stem stitch the spider legs. Using two strands of white embroidery floss or one strand white Floche, stem stitch the connecting thread.

Optional: After completing all the stitching, white fabric glitter can be applied lightly to the web and black fabric glitter to the spider body.

Trim block to 9-1/2" square after pressing lightly face down on a white towel to cushion applique.

# Spider Web Applique Template Page 1

Print both pages of templates. Overlap the two pages, aligning like items. Tape the pages together. Block outline should measure 9". Applique pieces following the order on the instruction page. NOTE: Place template face down for tracing for back baste applique.
