Save your scraps! Use them to make this quick and easy keychain. This tiny project is so much fun, you will want to make them for everyone on your gift list.

Fabrics Needed

Main fabric	2-1/2" x 3" rectangle or larger
Accent fabric for Prairie Points	Three 1" squares
Fussy-cut (focus print)	Approximately 1" x 2" rectangle

Materials Needed

1/2" wide ribbon	1-1/2" piece
Small size key clip	
Key Ring	
Legacy™ by Pellon® 100% Polyester Batting	5" square
Pellon® 805R Wonder-Under®	1 package (there will be leftovers)
Available by the yard, package or tape	

Tools Needed

- Sewing machine and related supplies
- Rotary cutter and related supplies
- Sharp scissors
- Pinking Shears

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Cutting and Assembly Instructions

Cut out the 'fussy-cut' (focus print) accent fabric leaving 1" extra on all sides of the design. Iron the Wonder-Under® to the wrong side of the fabric.

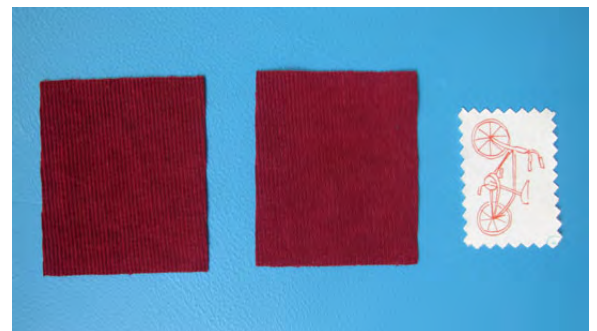


Use pinking shears to trim focus print fabric leaving 1/4" around the design on every side and framing the object into a rectangle.



Measure the length and width of the finished size of the focus print fabric. Add 1-1/4" to both dimensions to determine the size to cut the main fabric pieces.

Cut two pieces of the main fabric (red) and one piece of batting using these measurements.

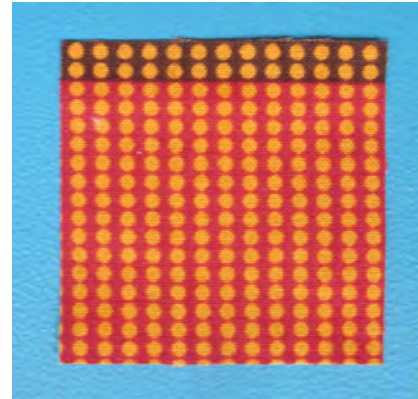


Remove the paper from the Wonder-Under® from the focus print fabric. Fuse this onto the center on the front side of one of the main fabric pieces. Topstitch around the focus print fabric at 1/8" and 1/4" in from the pinked edge.



Make three Prairie Points.

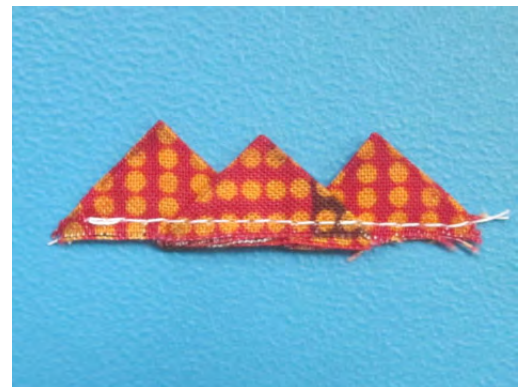
Cut three 1" squares of accent fabric.



Fold each square in half diagonally.



Fold the two smaller angle points together (not the 90° angle) to create the prairie point and align the raw edges. Line the Prairie Points in a row and baste together.



Baste the prairie points to the main fabric/focus print with the points facing toward the focus print.



Fold the 1-1/2" piece of ribbon in half and baste it to the main fabric with the focus print. Line up the raw edges.



Layer the two main fabrics and the batting in the following order: main fabric/focus print right side up, main fabric right side down, batting. Sew around all sides leaving a 1-1/2" - 2" gap on a long side for turning.



Press the seam allowances of the turning gap open.



Iron a small piece of Wonder-Under® on the seam allowance, along one side of the turning gap.



Remove the paper backing.



Clip corners and carefully turn the piece right side out. Use a blunt pencil or chopstick to poke out the corners.



Press the entire piece being careful to arrange the turning gap. Pressing will fuse the gap closed.



Topstitch around the entire piece using 1/8" and 1/4" seam allowances.

Attach key ring and key clip to the ribbon loop.
